



Composition: Sentences

Orally compose a sentence before writing

Write simple sentences

Sequence sentences to form short narrative

Uses vocabulary which is appropriate to the subject matter

Re-read work to check it makes sense e.g. notices missing words or sentences

Join words or clauses using 'and'

Growing accuracy of past and present tense

Include some detail in writing to add interest, for example an adjective

Begin to link ideas or events by subject or pronoun

Re-read work to check for missing punctuation

Punctuation

Begin to use full stops to end some sentences

Use full stops to end some sentences

Begin to use capital letters at the start of some sentences

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Use a capital for the personal pronoun 'I'

Begin to use capital letters for names (proper nouns including days of the week)

Begin to use question marks

Begin to use exclamation marks

Spelling

Make phonetically plausible attempts to spell unknown words

Use syllables to divide words when spelling

Spell words containing each of the 40+ phonemes already taught

Use prefix un correctly

Add ed / ing to root words where no change is needed

Spell most common exception words from English Appendix 1

Apply knowledge of other spelling patterns from English Appendix 1

Add s to nouns to make plurals

Spell the days of the week independently (applying some of the sounds)

Add es to nouns to make plurals

Add er / est to root words where no change is needed

Write from memory simple sentences dictated by the teacher that include words using the GPC's and common exception words taught so far

Handwriting

Sit correctly at the table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly

Begin to form lower-case letters and digits in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place

Form capital letters correctly

Form digits 0-9 correctly

Use spacing between words

Understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (letters formed in similar ways)

Become secure with ascenders and descenders.
